Hunter writes his name. He writes Mom's name.



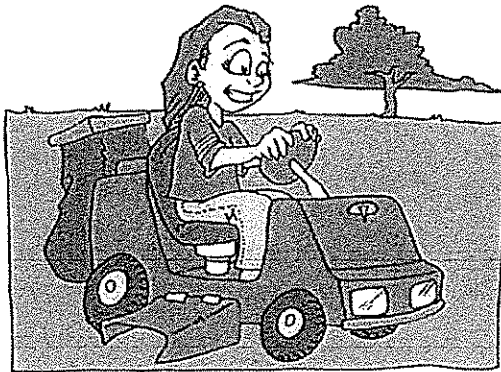
He draws himself, and he draws Mom.
