INDUSTRIAL ASSETS

- Grove Industrial Park with private and public lots available for sale.
- Utilities available to sites including high speed internet, water, sewer, gas and electric.
- Aerospace/Aeronautics cluster that includes four plus businesses with over 400 high-skilled aerospace jobs.
- Grove Regional Airport – located on Highway 10, under 20 minutes from the I-44 turnpike, 250 acre airport with a 5,200' x 75' runway and new terminal building.
- 6 acre Business Park owned by City of Grove.

ANNUAL TRAFFIC COUNTS

- City of Grove is located on US Highway 59 and State Highway 10 and is 15 minutes from the I-44 turnpike.
- Traffic along US Highway 59 and State Highway 10 in 2015 averaged approximately 13,000 vehicles per day and over 4.7 million vehicles annually.
