My name is Keturah, and I've been at CareCenter for 3 months. Before I came here, I thought I had it all together. Then, in the blink of an eye, I lost it all. I found myself once again in a jail cell alone, afraid, broken, and crying out for help. I've spent 2/3 of my life deeply lost in drug addiction. I was also enslaved by my need to feel accepted and loved. I got to the point where I had given up hope and was left questioning the value of my life. Then, one night, the Holy Spirit led me to write to Pastor Ty about CareCenter. I'm so glad I did! CareCenter fought to get me accepted into the program, and through the love and acceptance shown to me by the ministry, I've come to truly accept and receive the love of the Father. Now, I'm standing in the gap for my three teenaged children and breaking off generational curses. God is renewing and restoring me piece by piece. He is transforming me into the God fearing woman, wife, and mother He created me to be. I now know that life isn't about getting high or fulfilling the expectations of others. It's about fulfilling God's almighty purpose and calling for me. Today, I'm happy to be alive and thankful to God for bringing me to CareCenter.

## Ron's Story



My name is Ron Culver, and I have struggled with addiction for the last 30 years. I am only alive by the grace of God. I always thought I was a Christian, but once I came here, I discovered a true relationship with Christ. I realize now that I was only going through the motions before. God brought me to CareCenter on November 21st, 2018, and I was baptized by Pastor Ty on December 9th, 2018. That's when my true healing began. I am now a new creation, and I'm experiencing daily growth in my spiritual walk. Since I've been here, God has been moving in all parts of my life. He's begun restoring my family, which I once thought was impossible. He is so good! The 5 months that I've been here have been such a blessing. 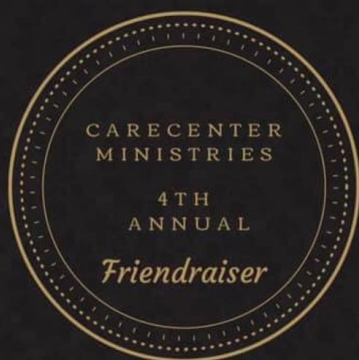

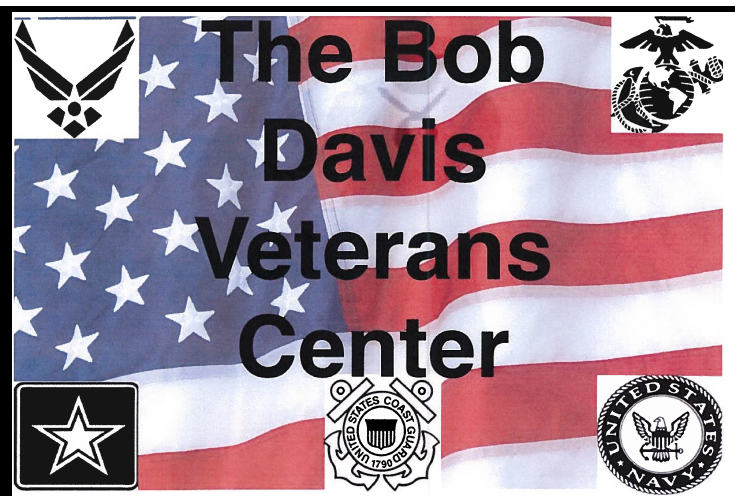
