Sherokee's Story



My name is Sherokee, and I came to Care Center almost five months ago. I arrived high, homeless, suicidal, and scared. My addiction had drained me of all my money and resources. It led me to quit my job, lose my home, and sign over my children. When I came here, I had truly come to the end of myself. I came here just to have a roof over my head for winter while I was deciding whether to live or die. But, deep down, I was longing and hoping for something more than the reality I was living. I didn't think I was searching for God, but that's exactly who I found. I'm here now regaining my identity, sanity, and self-worth. I have hopes and dreams and a joy I haven't known since childhood. Now, I have a future outside of pills, alcohol, and men. I know I still have a long journey ahead of me. But, I also know that I'm not alone in it now. I have a spiritual family here who will help me every step of the way. I have leaders and sisters who support me and love me. I'm falling in love with Jesus more day after day. I used to pray to God asking Him to give me my life back. Instead, He's giving me a beautiful new life that exceeds all I had ever hoped for.

Scott's Story



I grew up in a pretty odd family. I am the youngest of five boys, and we were all born within five years apart from one another. We all tried and tested every aspect of life. After we got older, we started to use drugs to be able to communicate with each other. I started to use more and more over the years until I got to the point where I would do anything that anyone put in front of me. I never noticed how it was affecting my life until I lost everything I ever cared about. My brother stopped talking to me, and I lost my wife and kids. My drug addiction continued to spiral out of control, but I had stopped caring. I was so chained down in addiction and the depression that accompanies it that I couldn't get out of bed for days at a time. In the midst of that darkness, something came over me that caused me to pack up some clothes and my teddy bear and go for a walk. God's grace led me to Care Center that day. I was an atheist until that happened, but now I have a love for the Lord and for others that are broken and looking for truth. I have a genuine love for all people, and I want to help others with any situation. I don't know exactly what the future holds for me, but I do know that I plan on doing the Lord's work. I want to help others that are struggling with the pain that I once was. I would love to minister to those that are still lost so that they may also find salvation and God's life changing grace.
