Official Notice - Non-Confidential Reporting

By making this report you are providing official notice to the university and authorizing the Title IX Coordinator) and/or Title IX Deputy Coordinator to begin an investigation. You have the right and can expect to have incidents of sexual discrimination to be taken seriously by the institution when formally reported, and to have those incidents investigated and resolved through administrative procedures. Formal reporting means that only people who need to know will be told, and information will be shared only as necessary with investigators, witnesses, and the accused individual as required and/or authorized by law.

Federal Statistical Reporting Obligations

Arkansas State University must report sexual offences for federal statistical reporting purposes under the Clery Act. All personally identifiable information is kept confidential, but statistical information must be passed along to campus law enforcement regarding the type of incident and its general location for publication in the annual Campus Security Report. This report helps to provide the community with a clear picture of the extent and nature of campus crime, to ensure greater community safety. The information to be shared includes the date, the location of the incident (using Clery location categories) and the Clery crime category. This reporting protects the identity of the victim and may be done anonymously.

Federal Timely Warning or Emergency Notifications

Victims of sexual discrimination should also be aware that, for certain crimes, Arkansas State University must issue timely warnings or emergency notifications to the campus community. The university will make every effort to ensure that a victim's name and other identifying information is not disclosed, while still providing enough information for community members to make safety decisions in light of the danger.

False Reports/Retaliation

False reports of sexual discrimination and retaliation against any person for reporting, filing, testifying, assisting, or participating in any manner in any investigation or proceeding involving allegations of sexual discrimination are strictly prohibited and will result in appropriate remedial action commensurate with the severity of the offense.
