K-2 Assessment

- K-1 Early Literacy Assessment, 2nd grade STAR Reading and STAR Math
- Dibels administered 3 times a year
- Fall Assessment-September
- Winter Assessment-December
- Spring-April
- ACT 940 of 2017 requires districts to report home the reading levels of students twice per year. Our district uses the assessment results to meet this criteria.





Commitment to Warrior Students

- Burst Intervention groups K-4; small group instruction, RTI-same time for grade levels
- Freckle-Scores from STAR assessments and ACT Aspire are imported and individualized to each student
- Susan Barton-Dyslexia remediation K-4; Two trained Dyslexia interventionists K-6 and 7-12, Language Live 5-12th grade students
- IXL Math K-4 individualized, 7th-8th grade Math, Language, Science
- After School Achievement Camp-Beginning October 7th for K-12 on Monday and Wednesday





ACT Aspire 2018-2019 3rd grade


3rd Grade 2018-2019




ACT Aspire 2018-2019




Comparison of our district scores in grades 7th-10th in relation to the state average in each content area.











High School Updates

Apex Learning for 9th-12th grade students. Utilized as credit recovery during summer school and to recover credits this semester

8 period day-allowed added time during the day for students to have a period of credit recovery, reduced some class sizes, and added study halls

Academic Reading Course-two-semester course designed to accelerate reading growth for students with dyslexia

Professional Development


Math teachers-attended training in the Kindle Hunt Illustrative math curriculum over the summer and are incorporating new techniques and strategies. The free curriculum has been effective in raising test scores in other districts

7th-12th teachers are currently attending training for the Science of Reading-this will help our teachers achieve an awareness of the practices and knowledge of reading instruction

Professional Learning Communities

We will begin developing PLCs beginning with our math teachers in November. This will allow time to discuss the new curriculum and determine best strategies for teaching math skills.


