COURSE GRASS UPDATE

As many have noticed, with the extreme conditions, we have had some thin and weak areas pop up on greens in the last few weeks. We have identified the pathogen, which is take all patch and root rot (Gaeumannomyces graminis). Take all patch has been increasingly tough to control on our greens over the last few years. We had been accustomed to spraying every 28 days to suppress the disease. Now we're finding we are forced to spray weekly just to keep it suppressed. Our L93 bentgrass is a very susceptible variety to this disease, and the age of our greens enhance the problem. Along with this issue, each year we have less and less air movement on greens 8, 12, 13, and 16. Air movement from either wind or fans can decrease the surface temperature of a green by 5-10 degrees.

With this said, I'd like to inform you of the plan moving forward to create the best playing surface we can daily:

- 1. Add fans to all our problem greens We have recently purchased one portable fan, and we're looking to purchase as many as six more. This will help half the problem immediately
- 2. Pruning/removing trees that shade or block wind to the greens We will be very strategic about the removal, and I doubt most people will notice. Over the years trees have grown to shade and block wind on 8, 12, 13, and 16 greens. During the Chuck Morton tournament, we had a 10-15 mph wind and the flags on those greens were mostly limp! This is a crucial 2nd step in the process.
- 3. Interseeding newer and more superior bentgrass seeds into our greens I know many people think the newer hybrid bermudas would be best, but over the last 6 months, I've been in contact with many superintendents, agronomists, and seed manufacturers about the situation. In another email, I will show how the negatives outweigh the benefits for us to convert to the newer bermuda varities due to our location. The newer bentgrass seeds are finer, more heat and disease tolerant, and are overall superior to our L93. Plainly, they just provide a better playing surface.

We have already seeded spots on 11, 13, and 16 with one of the newer bentgrass varieties as a test. Don't be alarmed, as these areas are roughed up a bit. We hope to have germination within two weeks. If the seed doesn't work, then we will plug it as usual. Our goal is to keep greens open and playable as we perform this process.

Let me be very clear to all, our greens are in fine shape to recover any damage, and right now, we're in no jeopardy of losing them. If you have any questions, then feel free to email me at brent.edens@bigcreekgolf.com


WINEMAKER NOTES:

We began by hand-selecting 7 exceptional Cabernet vineyard sites. Once the fruit reached its optimum level of ripeness and balance, we made the pick call and brought it into the winery. Upon arrival, we de-stemmed the fruit 100%. The grapes were then fermented in stainless steel tanks with native yeast and were given one pump-over daily during fermentation. The grapes were pressed and sent to barrels after 3 weeks on the skins, allowing malolactic fermentation to occur naturally. The barrels chosen to age this Cabernet were 20% new American oak and 80% neutral oak.
