**OVERVIEW**

The administration, faculty, and staff of Amanda Gist Elementary School believe that a student's education is a responsibility shared by the school and the family during the entire time the child attends our school. Our school and parents/guardians must work as knowledgeable partners to support the goal of the school to educate all students effectively.

The parent/guardians of students attending Amanda Gist Elementary School are diverse in culture, language, and needs. They are an integral component of the school's ability to provide for the educational success of their children.

Parental involvement is essential to ensuring the improvement of student achievement. The school should foster and support actual parent/guardian involvement in its educational endeavors by:

1. Involving parents/guardians of students at all grade levels in a variety of roles
2. Being comprehensive and coordinated
3. Recognizing that communication should be regular, two-way and meaningful
4. Promoting and supporting responsible parenting
5. Acknowledging that parents/guardians play an integral role in assisting student learning
6. Welcoming parents/guardians into the school and seeking parental support and assistance
7. Recognizing parents/guardians as full partners in the decisions that affect his or her child and family
8. Recognizing that community resources strengthen school programs, family practices and student learning.
9. Supporting the development, implementation and regular evaluation of the program to involve parents in the decisions and practices of the school district

The purpose of this Parent & Family Engagement Plan is to describe programs and practices in place at Amanda Gist Elementary that foster and support active parental involvement and reflect the specific needs of students and their families. ## **PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT PLAN**

### **“Parent Involvement Meeting” (Open House)**

An open house will be held annually near the beginning of the school year. It is an opportunity for students and parents/guardians to visit the school, meet with the principal or the

superintendent and talk with student's teachers for the upcoming year. The superintendent or principal will give a report on the state of the school. Also provided will be an overview of:

- What students will be learning
  - How students will be assessed
  - What parents/guardians should expect for their child's education
  - How parents/guardians can assist and make a difference in his or her child's education

Attendance is highly recommended for parents/guardians wishing to acquaint themselves with the campus and staff.

### **“Parent Involvement Meetings” (Evenings)**

“Parent Involvement Meetings” will be held periodically throughout the school year. These fun-filled evenings will focus on various parts of the curriculum and are designed to promote parental involvement in their child's learning experience.

### **Informational Packets**

To encourage communication with parents/guardians, Amanda Gist Elementary School will prepare “Informational Packets” which will contain:

### **Parent Center**

## **Welcoming Visitors to School**

Amanda Gist Elementary School welcomes parents, guardians and visitors into the school and seeks their support and assistance. For the safety of the students, we ask that all visitors sign in at the main office in the elementary building.

## **Volunteers**

Amanda Gist Elementary School encourages and welcomes volunteers. The school will compile a volunteer resource book each year. The resource book will be used to help match school needs with volunteer interests. It will be developed from the volunteer surveys completed and returned to school and will include:

- Parent survey information so volunteer work will be meaningful.
- How frequently a volunteer would like to participate, including the option of just one (1) time per year.
- Options for those who are available to help at home.
