



Anyone who is playing with a group that can verify their score for holes please turn in to the golf shop. There will be a box on the golf shop counter for this. We will need a combination of tees from Men (from Blue to Gold) and Ladies (Red) so anyone can help with this. Please be sure to have names on the scorecard and date. We will need to have 500+ scores to calculate new hole by hole handicap. (these are the handicaps you see on the course that makes hole 7 the hardest hole currently)

NEW PRACTICE / NURSERY GREEN COMPLETED!

Big Creek Superintendent Brent Edens and his crew were putting some finishing touches on our new practice / nursery green located at the end of the driving range near the #1 green this week. The new green is just slightly smaller than the existing putting green by the clubhouse.

The green has been seeded with Pure Distinction bent grass seed, one of the blend of new seeds we have been inter-seeding into the on-course greens, originally 100% L-93 bent grass. The staff rolled out Tahoma 31 bermuda grass sod yesterday to match the green surrounds we have on the course.

The completion of this three-year building process will help the club by giving us an additional facility for members to practice away from players about to start on #1 as well as a better place from which to borrow repair plugs of grass if any on-course greens are damaged. Currently we use the chipping green by #10 tee boxes for plugs as needed.

Brent estimates that the new practice / nursery green will be open to members for chipping and putting practice by sometime in June. Access will be behind #1 green where staff have established a pea-gravel path. Members will be asked to use caution when going to and from this new practice area when on the #1 cart path.



COURSE UPDATES

With March here, the golf season is upon us! We had a good 2023 season on the golf course with few problems, and we look to be even better in 2024. Our top priority is, and always will be, the condition of our greens. We will continue with the plans we've put into place over the past few years to improve conditions on the greens and green complexes. We hope the fabric we covered our Tahoma Bermuda collars with will pay off with less sod work coming out of winter. Unfortunately, this is an experiment, so we will have to wait and see.

Aeration dates are March 11-13. This aeration will be pretty aggressive, as we want to create as many holes as possible. We will then be trying out a new sand for topdressing and filling the holes which should be a better growing medium than our current straight sand mix. It's also nematode free, which we've started having more problems with over the last 4 years. Nematodes are tiny worms that feed on plant roots. They have been especially troublesome on our greens in recent years. We've put tremendous amounts of resources into our greens, and my hope is we start to see that investment pay off. As always, weather dictates most things we do, so hopefully, we finally get some cooperation from Mother Nature as well!

I've had a few people asking about the nursery green at the back of the driving range. We tried in 2022, late in the season, to build a makeshift nursery green, but we had to take a few shortcuts, and I didn't like the results. Now we are truly designing the green as a brand new green would be built. We hope to have it seeded and playable by May or June.

We are also continuing to work on the new white tee at #12. Our goal is to get it as level as possible and expand it more away from the cart path. If you have any questions or concerns, then please contact me at

BOOK OF THE MONTH

THE FEATHER THIEF WRITTEN BY: KIRK WALLACE JOHNSON

On a cool June evening in 2009, after performing a concert at London's Royal Academy of Music, twenty-year-old American flautist Edwin Rist boarded a train for a suburban outpost of the British Museum of Natural History. Home to one of the largest ornithological collections in the world, the Tring museum was full of rare bird specimens whose gorgeous feathers were worth staggering amounts of money to the men who shared Edwin's obsession: the Victorian art of salmon fly-tying. Once inside the museum, the champion fly-tier grabbed hundreds of bird skins--some collected 150 years earlier by a contemporary of Darwin's, Alfred Russel Wallace, who'd risked everything to gather them--and escaped into the darkness.

Two years later, Kirk Wallace Johnson was waist-high in a river in northern New Mexico when his fly-fishing guide told him about the heist. He was soon consumed by the strange case of the feather thief. What would possess a person to steal dead birds? Had Edwin paid the price for his crime? What became of the missing skins? In his search for answers, Johnson was catapulted into a years-long, worldwide investigation.
