Good morning Nathan & Brian,

I have a proposal from the Academic Affairs Committee for review of the staff and faculty senates. This proposal comes from the AI Workgroup, regarding a mandatory syllabus statement clarifying whether students are allowed to use AI tools for the class.

Just a note of information regarding the proposal — this is a direct address to the results of a recent survey of all students conducted by the AI Workgroup. Out of 124 respondents, 99 students indicated that they felt clarity from instructors regarding the use of AI was very important to them. This was the highest response to any question on the survey.

We are hoping to have this proposal moved through the approval process as quickly as possible, as the new syllabus template is currently being finalized.
