

How We Impact the Earth

Grade Level: K-2

Subject: Social Studies, Science

Standard: G.1.K.4 Describe the ways humans have impacted the environment (i.e. planting

trees, reducing waste, littering, polluting)

Objective: Students will understand how humans impact the environment and the differences between what is good for the environment and what is bad for the environment.

Materials:

- A picture book on the earth and the environment
- Pencil
- A printed "Ways to Help the Environment" activity sheet (see below)

Lesson Procedure:

Introduction:

- Ask "What do you think the word 'environment' means?"
- Call on a few students for their responses.
- Then explain that the "environment" is everything all around us.
- Show a picture of a clean environment and another one that's been polluted and ask how the pictures make them feel.

Read-Aloud:

• Read the students a picture book about the environment

Activity:

Have students complete an activity sheet on what's good for the environment and what
is bad for the environment.

Conclusion:

By the end of the lesson, students should be able to understand:

- The meaning of the word "environment"
- What a good, clean environment looks like
- What a bad, polluted environment looks like
- Littering
- Recycling
- Trees
- Waterways


