
MAKING OBSERVATIONS at the ASUMH Trail

HOW TO MAKE AN OBSERVATION:


- First, look at the object you're observing. What are the first things you notice about it?
- What color is it? What kind of texture does it have?
- Use all of your senses. What do you smell, feel, see, etc. ?

We will now practice observing some materials around the trail...



- It is brown and green.
- It has many ridges and curves.

We can conclude that this is part of a tree trunk.



- They are purple.
- They are round.
- There is a lot of them.
- It is a plant because it is growing from the ground.

We can conclude that these are flowers.




- It looks roughly textured.
- It is gray and tan.

We can conclude that this is part of a rock.



- They are purple.
- They have small petals.
- It looks like some sort of plant.

We can conclude these are flowers.



- It is brown.
- There are lots of different rocks.

We can conclude that this is a patch of dirt.
