A History of the Pope County Library System

Russellville

- 1885-86- The Excelsior Club Library is formed
- 1899- Meetings are held to discuss the formation of a public library
- o 1900- The Russellville Public Library Association is formed
- 1902- Library books are stored in the Wholesale Grocery Store
- 1904- Dr. H B Wiggs Drugstore becomes the new home of the 400-book collection; there is a \$1 yearly membership fee
- 1905-06- The books are housed by the San Scuco Club, Mrs. Jas. A. Miller, and Mrs. W. L. Oats. There are now 500
- 1918– The library is moved to Central Presbyterian Church
- 1920- The Russellville Loan Library opens
- 1924- A building is built for the library near the church,
- 1937- A library is built on 114 E.. 3rd St. (the site of Heritage Hall) by the WPA and holds a 5,000-book collection
- 1957- The Pope County libraries join with the Arkansas River Valley Regional Library System
- 1976- A new building, and current home, is built on 116 E.
 3rd St.
- 1985- The Pope County Libraries withdraw from the Arkansas River Valley Regional Library System
- 1989- The Don Harkey Addition and Katie Murdoch Genealogy and History Room are built

Atkins

- o 1933- The library room is established
- 1942- The library is moved to the Agricultural Building on the high school campus
- 1943- The library is moved into the high school
- 1958- The library is moved to East Broadway; it has 340 books
- o 1959- The library is moved to 219 E. Main
- 1975- A new building, and current home, is built on 216 NE 1st Street
- o 2000- The Mary Catherine Maxwell Room was completed

Dover

- o Late 1950s-Books are available in the rear of the Bank of Dover
- o 1974- The library moves to the new Dover City Hall
- o 1988- A new building, and current home, is built on Library Road

Hector

o 1996- The Hector Library is built

Bookmobile

- 1957- The Bookmobile first came to Pope County with the Arkansas River Valley Reginal Library System
- 1985- With the withdrawal from the Arkansas River Valley Reginal Library System, the Pope County Library purchased its own Bookmobile to continue outreach services

The Early Years

- Pope County was inhabited during the Mississippian Period (900-1600 AD) and possibly earlier, with rock art visible today.
- In 1541 Spanish explorer Hernando de Soto traveled through the Arkansas River Valley.
 Thomas Nuttall, another explorer traveled through in 1819.
- By the early 19th century, the Osage claimed the land north of the Arkansas River as hunting grounds but did not live there.
- 1808- The Osage sign a treaty giving up ownership of their hunting grounds in Arkansas
- 1817- The US government establishes a reservation for Cherokee from the eastern states; about 4,000 move
- 1820- At the request of the Cherokee leader Tahlonteskee, Dwight Mission is established. It contains a school, post office, library, sawmill, gristmill, blacksmith shop, gardens, and residences
- 1828- Kirkbride Potts settles and homesteads 160 acres
- 1828- A new treaty removes the Cherokee to Oklahoma; the Dwight Mission closes in 1829 to accompany them











1829 - 2024

- 1829- Pope County is established, named after John Pope, 3rd Arkansas territorial governor
- 1829- A temporary county seat is established near Scotia
- 1830- The county seat is established at old Norristown, settled by Samuel Norris in 1829
- 1832- The county secures a post office
- 1835- Dr. Thomas Russell buys a home in Pope County
- 1840- The county seat is moved to Dover; the first courthouse is a log structure that later burns in the Civil War and is rebuilt in Brick
- 1870- There are 13 townships and a public school system; Russellville is incorporated
- 1873- The Little Rock-Fort Smith railroad is completed through the valley
- 1876- Russellville has a population of 800, with a newspaper and a growing commercial sector
- 1888- The county seat moves to Russellville by a margin of less than 100 votes
- 1905-15- An earthen dam is built on the Illinois Bayou, but it erodes to uselessness
- 1909- The Second District Agricultural School, which later became Arkansas Polytechnic College then Arkansas Tech University, is founded
- 1910- The Agricultural School opens with 186 students
- 1923- Arkansas Power and Light (AP&L) rebuilds the dam which remains an important source of power
- 1935-43- The WPA is active in Arkansas; some of their projects in Pope County include building a school, a library, bridges, and roads, including the Russellville-Dover Highway, paving the streets of Russellville, and building dorms at ATU
- 1957-69- Dardanelle Lock and Dam number 10 is built
- 1965- Lake Dardanelle is in place
- 1966- Lake Dardanelle State Park is commissioned
- 1967- Plans for the construction of Arkansas Nuclear One are announced by AP&L
- 1970- AP&L constructs the second unit at ANO
- 1974- Unit One at ANO begins commercial operation
- April 4, 2024- Total Eclipse



Historic Points of Interest

- 1852- Pope County's first postmaster appointed in Russellville
- 1861-65- During the Civil War, Court House records are stored in caves near Dover to keep them safe
- 1869- Pope County has at least 13 public schools
- 1917- A vein of gold and silver is reported to be found within four miles of Russellville at Cagle's Rock
- 1925- St. Mary's Hospital is established and named after a local nurse
- 1930- Will Rogers visits the Tech Airport, which was later replaced by the Municipal Airport in 1960
- 1932- Attempts are made to organize Arkansas's first and only gold mine at the rediscovery of gold
- 1945- The Goldsmith Pickle Company is established in Atkins
- 1988- Louis and Thelma Gregoire of Pelsor donate a 100,000-piece collection of prehistoric artifacts to the US Forest Service; most pieces were found within a 15-mile radius of Lurton
- The Pope County vertical files contain at least one entry for 94 historic and current communities
