General Rules

1. The Baxter County Fair Association reserves the right to change and modify the rules and regulations governing the fair at any time.
2. Any deviation from these General Rules or Division-specific rules will make the exhibitors ineligible for cash prizes.
3. No cash premiums will be awarded for articles not listed in fair book.
4. No unworthy articles shall be eligible to receive a premium. Final decision made by supervisor of division.
5. Judges will be provided and the judge's decision will be final.
6. All exhibit awards will be on the point basis.
7. An exhibitor may enter one article in each class unless stated otherwise.
8. Precautions are taken to prevent damage to or theft of articles entered in the fair; however, the Fair Association will not be responsible in case of theft or damage.
9. State Matching premium money will only be awarded to exhibitors who are Baxter County residents.
10. Exhibitors must be a resident of Baxter County or an active member of a Baxter County 4-H, FFA, EHC Club, Masters Gardeners, members of MH Saddle Club, and N.A. Woodcarvers.
11. Baxter County Fair Officers and Board Members are eligible to enter any contest for prizes.
12. Junior Livestock Sponsorship checks will be available thirty (30) days after the last day of the fair. All checks must be cashed within 90 days of issue or will be forfeited.
13. No carnival ride tickets can be used the following year. All tickets must be used during the year in which they were purchased.
14. All vehicle deliveries inside the gate must be before 5:00 PM.
15. No pets are allowed on the fairgrounds. Only medical purpose animals will be allowed on Fairgrounds. (See #25 Service Animals)
16. No public address systems are to be used except by the Fair Association.
17. **There will be no parking inside the fairgrounds on either side of the livestock barn. This will be strictly enforced!**
18. Handicapped parking will be provided outside the North Gate (off Wade Street).
19. See individual Divisions for Division Rules.
20. Livestock requirements: See Livestock General Rules and Livestock Health Requirements.
21. No food may be prepared or stored in the Livestock Barn.
22. Service animals are defined as dogs that are individually trained to do work or perform tasks for people with disabilities. Example of such work or tasks include guiding people who are blind, alerting people who are deaf, pulling a wheelchair, alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure, reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications, calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack, or performing other duties. Service animals are working animals, not pets. The work or task a dog has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's disability. Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals under the ADA. Companion dogs will not be allowed into the Fairgrounds. Under the ADA, service animals must be harnessed, leashed, or tethered, unless these devices interfere with the service animal's work or the individual's disability prevents using these devices. All service animals are to be "housebroken". The Fair Board will continue to enforce the "No Animals Allowed on the Fairgrounds" unless the Fair has a pet day or animal show during the Fair week.

AUDIENCE CHOICE AWARD

We will have an Audience Choice Award in each category again this year. The public will be able to vote for their favorite contestant. A table will be set up in the lobby to cast your vote. Votes are \$1 each. You may vote as many times as you wish. Winners will be recognized on stage.

OVERALL AUDIENCE CHOICE AWARDS

We will have three overall Audience Choice Awards.

The categories are:

- (Tiny Tot king, Tiny Tot Queen and Tiny Miss)
- (Petite Miss, Little Miss, and Princess Miss)
- (Teen Miss and Miss Baxter County)

Winners will be recognized on stage.

CONDUCT: There will be **NO TOLERANCE** of any unsportsmanlike behavior or language by contestant, parent, or guardian. Such behavior will result in immediate disqualification of the contestant and all involved will be escorted from the premises.

PAGEANT CONTESTANTS are judged on the following:

1. BEAUTY: Physical appearance.
2. POISE AND STAGE PRESENCE: Grace and carriage of body.
3. APPROPRIATE DRESS FOR AGE: Gown, make-up and overall appearance.
4. PERSONALITY: Smile; friendliness.

JUDGES are from outside Baxter County and are experienced & qualified. We strive to be sure the contest is unbiased.

ONE ADULT PER CONTESTANT will be allowed in the dressing area and will pay an admission price of \$5.00.

NO MALES ALLOWED IN THE BACKSTAGE DRESSING AREA. One adult is required to be on stage and escort their child across the stage during the pageant.

** NO ONE IS ALLOWED IN THE WINGS OF THE STAGE EXCEPT THE CONTESTANTS AND MEMBERS OF THE PAGEANT COMMITTEE.

** YOUNGER SIBLINGS AND BABIES NOT IN THE CONTEST ARE NOT ALLOWED BACKSTAGE AT ANYTIME.

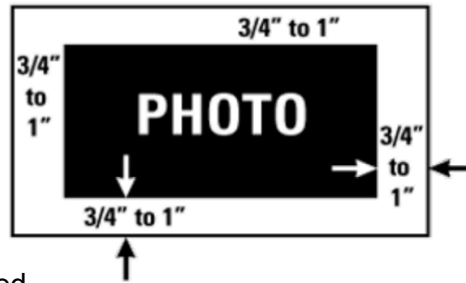

- Vases may not include submerged vegetable/fruit/plant material.
- Vases may not be made from or include fresh vegetable/fruit/plant material (i.e. pineapple or coconut).
- All foliage below the waterline MUST be removed.
- A Judge’s Best of Show may be awarded a \$10.00 prize by the Baxter County Fair Association to Adult and Junior/Youth Exhibitors, at judge’s discretion.
- Exhibitors may enter up to **ONE** entry per class.
- First place winners will be awarded **4** premium points per class.

LIVESTOCK

All entries will be made online and all entry fees will be paid online. All entry fees must be paid by September 8th. Visit baxter.fairwire.com to register.

On-Line entries OPEN August 1st and CLOSE on September 8th at baxter.fairwire.com.

GENERAL LIVESTOCK RULES

1. All animals are required to be in good health and will be inspected by a veterinarian upon arrival.
2. Animals must be removed from the fairgrounds if requested.
3. Health papers must be presented to barn superintendents before animals are unloaded.
4. Livestock must be in place by Wednesday at Noon.
5. Livestock may be checked out immediately after the Parade of Champions on Saturday.
6. Failure to comply with check out times will result in forfeiture of cash premiums.
7. In the case of no competition in any class, or where there are fewer exhibits shown in any class than the number of premiums offered, the judges may at their discretion award a prize or prizes of such grade as the exhibit deserves.
8. All owners of livestock, or others in charge, shall care for, guard, protect and preserve the same. The Baxter County Fair Association does not undertake to do so and it shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to said property to the owners thereof.
9. Exhibitors must validate the animal by the State Fair validation date for the current year.
 - a. All market animals must be validated by FFA instructor or the Baxter County Extension Office agent **prior to August 1st**. This applies to all market animals with the exception of meat rabbit division (see meat rabbit rules).
 - b. This does NOT apply to breeding animals, including wether dam sheep and goats.
 - c. Market animals that are not validated are not eligible to enter those market classes.
 - d. For more information, please contact your FFA instructor, your 4-H leader, or the Baxter County Extension Office agent (870-425-2335).
10. **Livestock stall/tack spaces will be assigned by Baxter County Fair Board.** Do not pre-mark spaces.
11. All animals are restricted to the livestock barn area.
12. Tie-out time will be 9:00 pm to 8:00 am at the designated tie-out area on the east side of the livestock barn. **Livestock that leave the Baxter County Fairgrounds are subject to disqualification.**
13. Exhibitors will supply their own bedding for the livestock.
14. All livestock, including poultry and rabbits, must be owned and raised by the exhibitor who is a resident of Baxter County or an active member of a Baxter County 4-H or FFA chapter and have proof of ownership and/or lease agreement form for the current show season year.
15. Junior Livestock Sponsorship Awards Presentation checks will be available on or after an awards program to be held at a later date. Livestock checks will NOT be available for pickup at the fair office. Check with your 4-H or FFA advisor for pickup.
16. **Livestock Entry Fees** - Entry fee per animal will be as follows:
 - a. Cattle - \$10.00
 - b. Goats, Sheep, Lambs, & Hogs - \$7.00
 - c. For Meat Rabbits see Meat Rabbit rules below.
 - d. **NOTE:** Animals shown in multiple classes must pay entry fees for each class.

17. Fitting & Grooming: No hair coloring of any type will be allowed to be used on any exhibit above the flank of the animal. Added hair or other material natural or man-made (excluding false switches, paints or glues) may not be used in the grooming of any exhibit. Painting of switches, tail heads, and top knots are permissible. Any attempt to change the composition or appearance of any animal in an unnatural manner will result in disqualification.
18. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injections (air) for cosmetic purposes is prohibited. Disqualification will result from these acts for this fair and possibly future fairs. Drenching of animals using appropriate methods is allowed in designated areas including wash racks, tie-outs, and in grooming chutes/stands.
19. **PENALTIES FOR INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS (IAFE) CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS VIOLATIONS.** Any exhibitors and all other parties found in violation of IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics will be prohibited from participating in the Baxter County Fair for that year, and possibly future years.
20. **All livestock exhibitors must complete and submit an Exhibitor Affidavit/IAFE form to the Fair Manager, Paula Bailey. This must be on file PRIOR to placing your exhibits (or by 4:00 pm on Wednesday of the fair).**
21. Only 1 animal per exhibitor may be sold at the Livestock Sponsorship Awards Presentation. (If an exhibitor shows more than one species of animal during the fair, he/she must pick only ONE of those animals for the Livestock Sponsorship Awards Presentation.)
22. Any challenge or grievance by an exhibitor must be presented to the Livestock Superintendent one hour prior to the start of show for that class. A \$100.00 fee will be assessed. If the complaint is verified, the \$100.00 fee will be refunded.
23. During the fair, any medicine or vaccine must be approved and administered by the Livestock Superintendent or a Veterinarian.
24. **Exhibitors ONLY are allowed in the showing arena when showing any market class.**
25. **Exhibitors ONLY are allowed in the showing arena for showmanship. An exception will be made for peewee exhibitors where an assistant may accompany the child.**
26. Baxter County Fairboard will abide by all ADA regulations.
27. Any items or concerns not listed in this section will be considered by the Livestock committee and their decision will be final.

IAFE

(INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS)

CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animal health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of violative drug residues. The act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of, consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs other than in accordance with applicable federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the laboratory, to which it is sent, is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved and all procedures of said collection and preservation, transfer to the laboratory and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate and the report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the

burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or the external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.
6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices such as striking animals to cause swelling, using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.
7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.
8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.
9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.
10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expos and any special notices to members.
11. The act of entering of an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by the code. It is further a consent that any action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.

LIVESTOCK SHOW

Exhibitors:

When arriving with livestock enter through the South Gate by rodeo arena & exit through East Gate on to Arena Drive.

Exhibitor Divisions:

- Junior: 5 years thru 18 years or active member of Baxter County 4-H or FFA Chapters.
- Senior: all other exhibitors.

SHOWMANSHIP:

All entries for a showmanship class must enter online through ShoWorks prior to closing of on-line entries. Showmanship classes in livestock will include:

- Pee-wee (up to age 8)
- Junior (ages 8 thru 13)
- Senior (ages 14 thru 19).

Age determination will be the exhibitor's age as of the opening day of the fair. All animals must comply with health requirements outlined in individual livestock divisions below.

For cattle, goats, sheep and swine showmanship, exhibitors must own the animal that is shown. An exception will be made for peewee exhibitors.

Awards:

Showmanship awards in livestock will be presented to pee-wee, junior and senior exhibitors. Awards will also be presented to poultry Best Of Show and rabbit Best Of Show junior and Senior exhibitors.

A herdsman award and runner-up award will be presented to two junior exhibitors in the livestock division.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR LIVESTOCK

All animals entering the grounds must meet the requirements of their particular species. Arkansas livestock (except for Arkansas sheep, goats, horses, steers and rabbits) must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 90 days prior to exhibition, showing the following:

Cattle Health Requirements:

1. If Arkansas is a class free state, Arkansas cattle are exempt from brucellosis testing. If Arkansas is not a Class Free State, then the following testing requirements must be met: Negative brucellosis test within ninety (90) days prior to exhibition, for females and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and over. All heifers that have calved or are bred must be tested. Animals originating from a Certified Brucellosis Free Herd are exempt if the Certified Free Herd number is shown on the certificate.
2. All heifers that are 4-12 months of age shall be vaccinated before entering the show.
3. Heifers that were born on or after January 1, 1986, that are over 12 months of age and are not officially calf hood vaccinated will not be allowed to show (unless they are from a Brucellosis Certified Free Herd.) This will not apply if Arkansas continues as a Brucellosis Free State.
4. Cattle with excessive warts will not be allowed on fairgrounds.

Sheep and Goat Health Requirements:

1. Fair personnel, veterinarians, or state-federal personnel may examine sheep and goats on grounds.
2. No sheep or goats showing symptoms of disease, particularly foot rot, sore mouth, sheep pox, evidence of fungal infection, evidence of abscesses or with draining abscesses will be allowed to show and may be released by fair officials, veterinarians, or state-federal personnel.
3. Goats showing evidence of any other disease may be removed from fairgrounds.

Swine Health Requirements:

1. As of July 1, 2003, all swine must have an official premise identification.
2. Animals 6 months old or older to be tested negative for brucellosis within 90 days of exhibition or originate out of a Validated Herd, with Validation number and date of last herd test shown on certificate (barrows exempt from brucellosis testing, but must be pseudorabies tested.)
3. Animals to be tested negative for pseudorabies within 90 days of the exhibition on a test approved by the State Veterinarian or originate directly out of a Qualified Pseudorabies Free Herd, with Qualified Herd number and date of last test shown on certificate.
4. Free of other contagious, infectious, and communicable diseases (erysipelas, atrophic rhinitis, etc.); otherwise they will not be allowed to show and will be removed from fairgrounds.

Poultry Requirements:

1. All in-state poultry, which includes domesticated game birds, quail, pheasants, peafowl, guineas, and turkeys, present at exhibitions in Arkansas shall have originated from the U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean or equivalent flocks or have had a negative pullorum-typhoid test within ninety (90) days of the movement to the exhibition (pullorum-typhoid testing on fairgrounds during the fair is prohibited.) This information will be documented on a NPIP Form VS 9-3, 90 Day Certificate, NPIP Flock Certification Form or similar certificate which will accompany the poultry during exhibition.
2. All non-certified birds must be banded (leg or wing band), with a sealed band. Wrap-around plastic bands are not acceptable. In state waterfowl are exempt from pullorum-typhoid requirements.

NOTE: All backyard chickens and turkeys must be blood tested. Testing will take place Wednesday of the fair from 8 am to Noon at the lot next door to the Fairground Office, 1507 Fairgrounds Drive, prior to entry.

3. Any poultry showing evidence of infectious or contagious disease or insect infestation will not be permitted to exhibit.

Sheep Health Requirements:

1. Sheep will be inspected on grounds.
2. No sheep showing symptoms of disease, particularly foot rot, sore mouth, and sheep pox will be allowed to show.

Horse Health Requirements:

1. All horses must be healthy and serviceably sound.
2. A negative Coggins test conducted within 12 months is required for all animals.

IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR SHEEP AND GOATS

All sheep and **all market goats** must have a Scrapie Identification Tag upon arrival on the fairgrounds. All registered goats entered in breed shows must possess a legible tattoo that is recorded on registration certificate and do not require a Scrapie ID Tag. Any registered animal participating in the Market Goat Show must also wear a Scrapie ID tag.

If you need a Scrapie ID call 1-866-USDA-Tag for free tags and tagger.

Any sheep or goat showing clinical symptoms of scrapie shall be immediately quarantined in isolation and required to undergo any approved diagnostic tests and shall be consigned to slaughter or destruction with submission of tissues to an approved diagnostic laboratory at the exhibitor's expense. Commingling (as defined by the Arkansas Scrapie Regulation) of sheep or goats of different flock status as defined by the Voluntary Flock Certification Program (VFCP) is prohibited and must be reported to the VFCP state official and State Veterinarian.

- All animals must comply with health requirements. All animals are required to be in good health, subject to veterinarian inspection, and must be removed from the fairgrounds if requested. Health papers must be presented to critter barn superintendents before animals are unloaded.
- Rabbits must arrive on Wednesday, the week of the fair from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm
- Poultry must arrive on Wednesday, the week of the fair from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm. Poultry and Rabbit exhibits must be checked out between 8:00 am and 2:00 pm Sunday, the week of the fair. Failure to comply with check out times will result in forfeiture of cash premiums.
NOTE: All backyard chickens and turkeys must be blood tested. Testing will take place Wednesday of the fair from 8 am to 2 pm at the lot next door to the Fairgrounds Office, 1507 Fairground Drive, prior to entry.
- In the case of no competition in any class or where there are fewer exhibits shown in any class than the number of premiums offered, the judges may at their discretion award a prize or prizes of such grade as the exhibit deserves.
- Only 4-H/FFA Pens of 4 Pullets are allowed in the Egg Production Contest. Starting at 7:00 am Thursday and ending at 12 Noon on Saturday.
- 4-H Hen Sale will not be as in the past but rather will be a silent auction that lasts all week. Saturday at noon will be the deadline to place bids. All chickens must be picked up on Sunday!

DIVISION 58: POULTRY

- **Exhibitors must bring your own feed.** You are responsible for feeding & watering your exhibit. See health requirements.
- Ribbons will only be awarded to birds that deserve a ribbon based on breed characteristics, appearance and health at the judge's discretion.

DIVISION 59 – EGGS

DIVISION 80: MARKET STEERS

- Steer must be owned by the exhibitor by the State Fair validation date of the current year to be eligible to show and participate for the sponsorship awards.

- All cattle must be halter broken and under control of the exhibitor at all times. Any animal that presents risk due to lack of control may be removed from the show.
- Minimum weight is 1000 lbs.
- Steers will be graded Prime or Choice, Select or Standard according to USDA Slaughter Standards.
- Steers must grade at least Select to be eligible for the Junior Livestock Sponsorship Awards Presentation.
- Only one steer per exhibitor will be entered in the Livestock Sponsorship Awards Presentation.
- **Exhibitors must bring your own feed**. You are responsible for feeding & watering your exhibit.

DIVISION 81:COMMERCIAL HEIFERS
